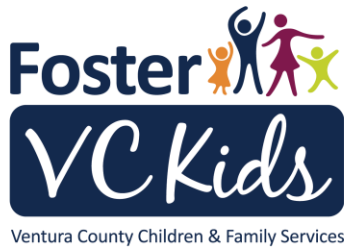

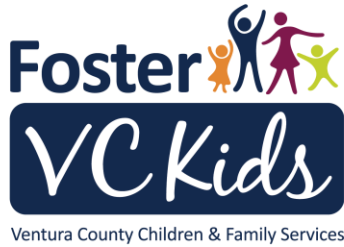

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Ventura County believes that every court-dependent abused or neglected child should be safe, have permanence and the opportunity to thrive, and have a strong, compassionate volunteer advocate. CASA recruits, screens, trains, supervises and support volunteers who advocate for foster children appointed by the Juvenile Dependency Court to the CASA program. The CASA Advocate is the person who can be counted on to respond to those most basic needs for reassurance, guidance, comfort, representation and advocacy in times of extreme uncertainty, and is the one constant, positive presence in the child's life until a permanent placement can be secured. [Channel Islands Social Services](#)

County licensed foster parents, relative caregivers, and resource families are eligible for up to **12** hours of FREE respite care each month. Families caring for **Ventura County dependent children** ages 12 or under, or a child with special needs, are automatically eligible and can contact [Channel Islands Social Services](#) directly at **805-384-0983** to register. If your family is caring for children over 12 or requires more than 12 hours, social workers can request an exception to the basic eligibility. These cases will be reviewed for need, natural support system, and plan for when the short term exception ends. FFA certified homes are eligible for respite and should contact their agency for more information.

[United Parents Respite Program](#)

United Parents Respite Program provides short term breaks for caregivers raising children with mental health, emotional and behavioral disorders for a small co-pay. Child/teen must be a client of Ventura County Behavioral Health. Trained respite providers offer group and individual activities that promote pro-social interactions with other children, in or outside of the home. Families pay on a sliding scale, usually \$1-\$5 an hour for up to ten hours a month of respite care. Child Care/Child Development

Child Development Centers

Child Development Inc. operates early care and education that serve children birth through twelve years of age. They offer a variety of infant, preschool and school age programs. They work with school districts to provide before and after school programs, including homework assistance and kindergarten readiness programs to families. CDC also provides preschool programs in Oxnard, Fillmore, Ventura, Thousand Oaks, & Port Hueneme. Foster children are often eligible for priority assignment into a program and subsidized care. Call 805-483-6756 or visit www.cdcdc.org/programs Contact your Social Worker to have them submit the CDC referral and the CEWL application to be placed on the eligibility waitlist.

Child Development Resources

[Child Development Resources](http://www.childdevelopmentresources.org) administers a range of childcare programs and provides referrals to community child care providers. Foster children may receive priority assignment from the wait list and subsidies with verification from their social worker that the child is a court dependent minor. In order to apply, foster parents should complete the following steps:

1. Complete the Centralized Eligibility List Application, which can be downloaded here: www.childdevelopmentresources.org/PDFLibrary/CDRCCELAPPLICATIONJuly2011ENG.pdf
2. Foster VC Kids will provide a letter of verification of the child's dependent status. Please email HSA-CFS-Resources@ventura.org to request this verification.
3. Submit application and letter directly to CDR.

Children's Home Society (CHS)

Children's Home Society provides a variety of services to children and families in California and nationwide — working to improve their quality of life by offering vital informational, educational, and resource services, which include Community Education Services, Child Care and Development Services, and Family Resource Services. Along with helping children and their families, CHS is an expert resource for child care providers, other social service agencies, and government agencies at the local, state, and national level. Foster children are often eligible for priority assignment into a program and subsidized care. To access services for childcare, resource families will need to complete and submit an application. They can do this online at www.CHS-CA.org, go in to the office or call 805-437-1910 and request an application be mailed. Services provided are based off the child's income, and resource families will need to have a referral letter from their Case Worker to add to the application. Contact HSA-CFS-Resources@ventura.org if you require verification of the child's involvement in foster care.

The Easter Seals Child Development Center serves children ages 2-5. Foster children typically qualify for very low or no cost services. Preschool scheduling is dependent on the family's work or school schedule and will be determined at the time of application. Training

Caregivers are required to complete a minimum of 10 hours of continuing education each year. Foster VC Kids encourages a blend of online, in-person, and networking groups to receive these hours. 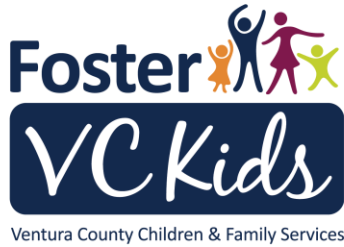

Medical, Mental & Behavioral Health

Foster Health Link: This "electronic health backpack" is a website and mobile app that provides caregivers with health information about the children in their care. Also available through Foster Health Link is the Network of Care; this is a searchable-online database that provides information about medical conditions, medication, mental health, and local services providers. Caregivers will be able to access the current Health Education Passport (HEP) for children in their care in an electronic format by logging onto Foster Health Link from their computers or smart devices. Training on how to use Foster Health Link is available on our website, www.fostervckids.org. Caregivers will need an email address to be able to access the portal. **Please also remember to send an email to fostervckids@ventura.org so we can add your email to the database!**

CFS Eligibility Unit: For questions about your child's Medi-cal/Gold Coast Health Care Plan benefits, you can contact the officer of the day in the Eligibility unit at 805-654-3444.

Health Care Program for Children in Foster Care: Public health nurses provide education and coordination to medical, dental, developmental, and mental health care needs to Ventura County children in out-of-home placement. They work closely with foster parents, social workers, probation officers and others to prevent illness and provide well child care. You can reach a nurse at 805-240-2700.

Mental Health Services: If you have concerns about your child's emotional health or behavior, and believe he/she may benefit from a mental health assessment, please speak to the child's social worker immediately. Your child will be screened and may be referred to be assessed and treated through Ventura County's Behavioral Health Child Welfare Subsystem Program and contract providers. Individuals needing Health Services or are experiencing a mental health crisis can call 866-998-2243, 24 hours, 7 days a week.

LGBTQ+

Foster VC Kids partners with the [Diversity Collective Ventura County](#) and [The Coalition for Family Harmony](#) to serve the LGBTQ+ community of Ventura County.

The Coalition for Family Harmony: Offers a new [LGBTQ+ Program](#) providing a variety of free services for LGBTQ+ youth who experience bullying, abuse, and violence affecting them. The mission of the program is to improve access to the Coalition's trauma informed services. Youth ages 12 years and older are provided mental health counseling and a unique clinician-community member led youth group that meets Wednesdays from 5:30 p.m. - 7:00 p.m.

Community education and networking events for youth are held through the year, and Teen Dating Violence workshops are available upon request. Referrals to our LGBTQ+ centered community partners can be provided, based on the needs of youth and their caregivers. In-home Support Programs
